This is a trade qualification for carpenters in residential and commercial workplaces. It includes setting out, manufacturing, constructing, assembling, installing and repairing products made using timber and non-timber materials.

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ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- 18 years or over
- Basic computer skills (Word, Excel or similar)
- LLN proficiency sufficient for a minimum entry level worker (AQF level III) in the field of construction.
- Access to a compliant construction worksite(s) with the full range of environments, equipment and facilities that meet training package requirements.
- Holds a current White Card and/or Site Specific Induction

RPL CANDIDATES

Candidates must provide evidence of currency and experience by working in the carpentry field of construction for a minimum of 12 months within the past 18 months. A letter on company letterhead from current/past employer(s) verifying this is required.

COURSE DELIVERY

The qualification offers a maximum period of 104 weeks (including 8 weeks holiday) from the date of commencement in which to complete their studies and submit all work for assessment. Students will attend face-to-face 2 x days per week 9am-5pm. This includes training and assessment. In addition students are

required to complete up to a maximum of 5 hours per week independent, unsupervised activities.

- Telephone, email support
- Work place supervisor (3rd Party Report)
