

Qualification Description	This qualification reflects the role of builders, site managers and managers of small to medium-sized building businesses who apply knowledge of structural principles, codes, standards and legal requirements to Class 1 and 10, to a maximum of two storeys and Class 2 to 9 Type C constructions, and who plan and supervise safe building and construction work, prepare and administer contracts, and who apply quality principles to building and construction projects.				
	Building relates to construction and Site Management is about managing the factors around construction, such as the deployment of crews with specialised skills (including builders), product compliance, deployment of contract specialised skills, weather and site location.				
	All international students need to apply to Camden College using the prescribed " <i>International Enrolment Form</i> ", which needs to be submitted complete and signed.				
	Student application: All applications from international students will be assessed against the following criteria:



	All students must provide evidence of the unit CPCCWHS1001 - Prepare to work safely in the construction industry or CPCWHS1001 - Prepare to work safely in the construction industry meet this requirement. This is required prior to the Simulated Workshop sessions as detailed within the student'S timetable.

	Learners and trainers have access to high-quality, relevant facilities and training rooms where the theoretical training is conducted.	
	Upfront information about this course offering will be available on our website. All international students need to apply to Camden College using the prescribed <i>"International Enrolment Form"</i> , which needs to be submitted complete and signed. Camden College staff will assess the supporting documents provided by international students to ensure the Eligibility and minimum entry criteria are met prior to issuing a " <u>Letter of Offer (LoO)</u> ". A written agreement is also included within " <u>Letter of Offer (LoO)</u> ".	
	Training is offered by Camden College in accordance with pre-determined study and break/holiday periods. Details of specific study periods and holidays are detailed within the students timetable which is provided to students at Orientation.	
	Students will receive an email " <u>Orientation Invitation</u> " from Camden College approximately one week prior to your commencement date welcoming them to our college.	
Student Support	Orientation occurs the Thursday morning before the students scheduled class times begin. Students will be expected to arrive at 10:00 am on Orientation Day. On orientation day students will be introduced to college staff, shown around Camden College facilities they will also be provided with detailed information about Camden College, their course, LMS, the timetable and unit schedule, their rights and responsibilities and other important information about their enrolment at Camden College. All students receive their individual tool kit during this.	
	We recognise that not all people are able to read, write and perform calculations to the same Standards. We will endeavour to help you where we can accommodate anyone with difficulties with Language, Literacy or Numeracy.	
	All students are required to undertake a Language, Literacy and Numeracy assessment administered during their orientation which must be before they commence training. The assessor will need the information contained within the assessment to understand students' literacy, language, and numeracy skills, and identify if they may require extra support during the training program.	
	The Trainer is to arrange a time to go through the results of the assessment with the student and discuss the questions the student got wrong with them. The Trainer is to detail the discussion and the steps required (using the strategies below) that will be used to support the student. Once a mutually agreed upon plan of action has been set out, which could include being provided with additional learning materials or one on one lessons with their trainer, it will be documented in the learner file.	
	If Camden College does not have specific support required by specific learners, Camden College will assist the student in identifying alternative training organisations that can provide the specialist support. Camden College's will make available its full resources to ensure the learner achieves the required level of competency in the qualification.	



	Students requiring additional holidays which are outside of the pre-determined	
	break/holiday periods, must gain approval from Student Services using " <u>Camden College's</u> <u>Leave Application Form</u> ". This form must be completed and returned to Student Support Services 2 weeks prior to the start date of the additional holidays being applied for.

Client Learning Needs	 RPL and experience: A process is in place to address those candidates who are eligible to apply for RPL based on prior education and or work experience. Ability of the student will be identified through the application process and interviews. Advice and support will be given where possible. Cultural and socioeconomic factors of the student will also be taken into consideration during assessment and training. Training and assessment materials are written in plain English.
